

WIZARD FORAGE OAT



KEY FEATURES

- Sets a new benchmark for yield in forage oats, 9% over current market leading varieties Aladdin and Genie, 15% over Drover and Taipan
- Good early growth similar to Genie and better than Aladdin
- Excellent recovery from grazing and cutting
- Currently resistant to most Australian pathotypes of leaf rust but has been found to be susceptible to a new strain
- Medium maturity.

- More feed for longer periods both early and through winter

DESCRIPTION

Wizard is one of the latest releases from the leading forage development partnership between The Queensland Department of Agriculture and Heritage Seeds. Wizard presents significant improvement in yield over other forage oats in the market. Wizard has an erect early growth habit, medium plant height, high tillering and fine leaves and stems. Speed to initial grazing is quick, similar to Genie and quicker than Aladdin.

With normal planting time (March – April), Wizard has medium maturity being 5–7 days earlier to anthesis than Genie but 5–7 days later than Volta.

Stem and leaf thickness of Wizard is slightly finer than Genie. It also tends to be higher in tillering and have better recovery from cutting and grazing than Genie.

Wizard will provide growers with a high yielding forage option, with medium / late maturity and excellent recovery in the winter months.

*There are reports of a new pathotype of leaf rust that infects Wizard. In the absence of this pathotype, Wizard will appear resistant.



VARIETY MANAGEMENT /AGRONOMY


Wizard is suitable for grazing, hay and silage production in all areas of central and southern Queensland, as well as northern New South Wales. Grazing trials indicate that Wizard is readily accepted by cattle, with no apparent differences in palatability or fresh weight intake compared with current forage oat varieties.


